Teaching and Learning

Reception

This February, Reception was very busy exploring new books and showing off their phonics skills. We read "The Remember Balloons" and wrote about our favourite memories with friends and family, "Who ate Steve" as part of Spark! School Book Awards and "Smile out loud" for some happy poetry.

In Maths, we explored numbers to 10 and adding different groups. Reception has started to show their Maths working out using addition and subtraction number sentences!

Wheat Aleph is excited to have started their new topic – Around the World. We have received a visit from Paddington Bear and have begun our voyage through the continents, starting off with Europe. We have role played going through the airport and flying on a plane, learned about Italy and Leonardo da Vinci, and listened to the Continent song.



Year 1

In English, we have been exploring a new text called "Stuck", which we used to inspire us to write a new version. The children worked hard to substitute the character, problem and solution from the original story while keeping the main structure. I was very pleased with the outcome – well done to all of them.

In History, we finished our topic of Toys with teddy bears and how they have changed over time. Some children brought their own teddy to show the class, and all the children created a timeline to show teddies from the past to now.

In PSHE, the children have been learning about symptoms of illnesses and how medicine can be used as treatment. They have been using their oral and Drama skills in designated role-play scenarios.

For the past two weeks, the children have been completing their hand puppets inspired by the Little Red Riding Hood story in Design and Technology lessons. They used their joining and design skills to create some amazing puppets.

Our indoor PE lessons were all about travelling and using gymnastic shapes. We explored travelling in different ways around the room and on benches, as well as practising log and egg rolls on the mat. The children showed great balance and coordination when using gymnastic shapes such as Straight, Tuck, Straddle and Pike.

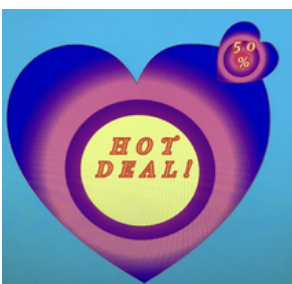
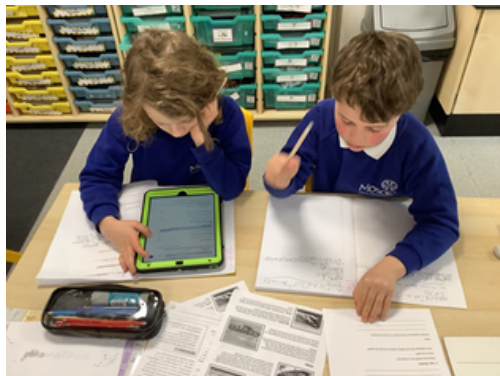
Year 2

In Year 2 this February, the children have been busy with exciting learning activities.

In English, we have been writing our own adventure stories inspired by “The Day the Crayons Came Home”, following the journey of Esteban the Magnificent as he set off on his quest. The children followed a structured approach to writing their adventure stories. They began by creating a vivid setting to bring Esteban’s journey to life. Next, they wrote the beginning of the story, introducing the character and the setting of the story. They then built up the excitement by adding details about the journey before introducing a problem or challenge for Esteban to overcome. After that, they worked on a resolution, thinking creatively about how the problem could be solved. Finally, they wrapped up their stories with an ending that brought the adventure to a satisfying close.

Science lessons were filled with hands-on investigations, where the children compared different materials to see which were most suitable for specific uses. They also recorded their findings in block graphs and tested which paper fold could create the strongest bridge.

To round off the term, in Art, they completed their fantastic clay houses, showcasing their creativity and fine motor skills. It has been a wonderful and productive month.



Year 3

In English, we’ve been diving into the world’s most extreme and awe-inspiring continent—Antarctica! Using a combination of non-fiction books and carefully selected online resources, students embarked on a research journey to uncover fascinating facts about its icy landscapes, wildlife, and explorers. They then channelled their newfound knowledge into crafting detailed non-chronological reports, honing their writing and research skills.

Our budding scientists have been getting their hands dirty—literally! We’ve been investigating rocks and soils through hands-on experiments, sparking curiosity about the Earth’s foundations. Most recently, we conducted a permeability test on different soil types to determine which would be best for growing plants or construction. Our findings led to exciting discussions about how soil composition affects everyday life!

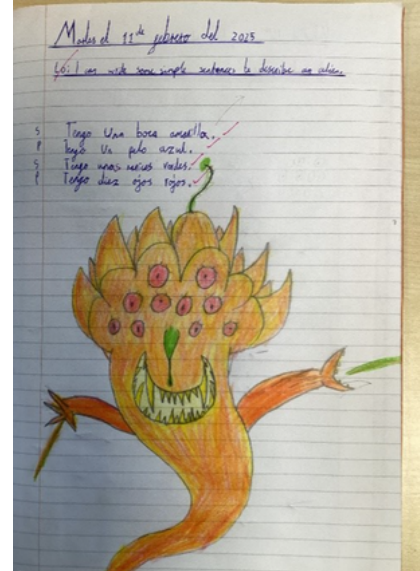
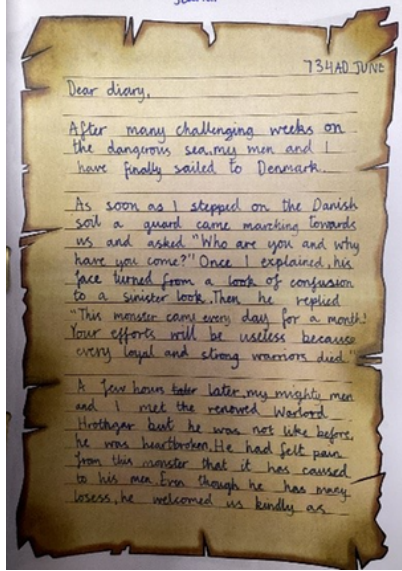
Innovation was at the heart of our D&T lessons as students explored wearable technology. Using Micro:Bit devices, they designed and programmed their own interactive products, bringing creativity and technology together in an exciting way. To complete the experience, they created digital point-of-sale badges, enhancing their understanding of branding and product presentation.

It’s been a fantastic few weeks of discovery, experimentation, and innovation!

Teaching and Learning

Year 4

English: This term we have gone back in time to the age of Anglo-Saxons and looking at one powerful and courageous warrior in particular: Beowulf. We read his story and discussed the pages and chapters from front to back to fully understand how much of a hero he was. The pupils independently completed a diary extract as if they were him arriving to the wild place of Denmark, to successfully kill the terrifying beast Grendel. I have never seen Year 4 in such awe of a character and everything that he represents. It was a very fun half term learning all about him.



Spanish: This is the second academic year that Year 4 have been learning Spanish, and their knowledge and skills have been progressing wonderfully. This half term we have looked at facial features and combined it with our existing knowledge of numbers and colours. Therefore, the pupils were having a very fun and creative time when designing and completing their alien characters and explaining all about their physical features: It has 5 blue eyes and red hair (tiene cinco ojos azules y pelo rojo).



Design and Technology: Each team has managed to come together and create their own 3D Pavilion structure, and the results are incredible! Each team worked fantastically hard to gather and use the necessary materials to create the pavilions and make sure that they resembled their original plans and ideas when completing the designing stage. During the month, the pupils went from being cautious hot glue gun users to absolute professionals and Mrs Novak and I can't believe how sturdy and secure each structure is.

Year 5 - Olive Aleph



In English, we have started reading "Song of the Dolphin Boy", a fascinating story that ties into our Humanities topic on oceans. This week, pupils have been busy planning and drafting newspaper articles about the threats facing the Great Barrier Reef. Working in pairs, they researched key facts about this incredible natural wonder and explored the dangers it faces, such as climate change, pollution, and coral bleaching. Their articles highlight the importance of protecting marine life and keeping our oceans healthy.

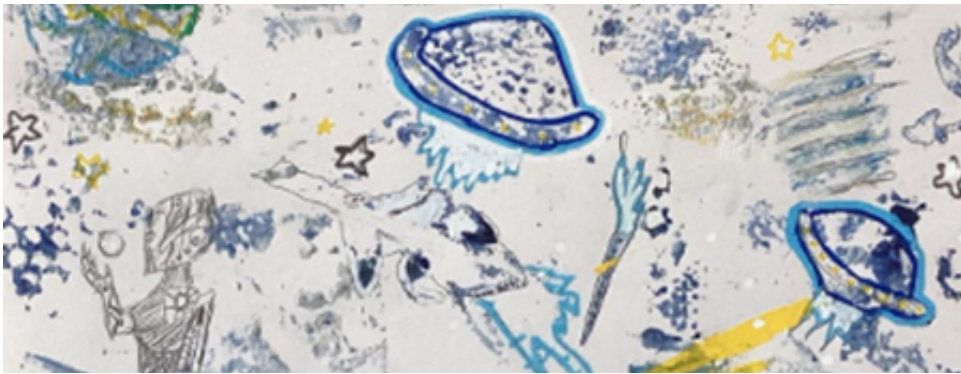
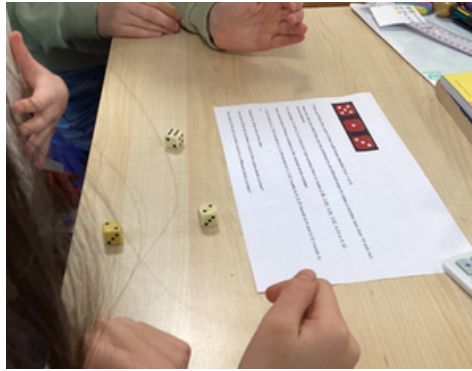
Our key question for Humanities this term is 'How do we use our oceans?' Pupils have been investigating how different countries rely on the sea for trade and transportation. We explored how goods and services are imported and exported across the world, and how shipping routes connect different countries. This has given pupils a greater understanding of the role oceans play in our everyday lives, from the food we eat to the products we use.



In PSHE, we have started our new topic on hygiene and the importance of keeping our bodies clean. We discussed daily hygiene routines and why they are essential for staying healthy. Pupils shared their own tips on personal care and are learning how good hygiene habits can prevent illness and promote well-being. We are looking forward to an exciting term ahead, full of discovery and learning!

Teaching and Learning

Year 5 - Olive Bet



Throughout the term, we have been busy creating our own space-themed artwork. Inspired by Teis Albers, we experimented with a range of mark making and printing techniques in preparation for our final project.

In Maths, we have really loved our learning on fractions, decimals and percentages – we had a great time on Number Day when we applied our mathematical knowledge to games and life skills such as financial literacy.

In PSHE, we have been learning about how to stay healthy and take care of our bodies. We were whizzes with nutrition and were able to identify what makes up a healthy diet and even admitted that sweets and treats are only good in moderation! We're looking forward to applying this learning to our upcoming DT unit when we create our own recipe for a healthy Bolognese sauce.



Year 6

To start the new Half Term, Year 6 are looking at Newspaper reports and how to write them.

In Maths, we have been calculating area and perimeter. Using Trundle wheels and other measuring equipment, we measured the area of our classroom to be approximately 55m squared, just a little bit smaller than Mr Bentley's flat.

Tu Bi'Shvat 2025

Earlier this month, Mosaic celebrated a very important birthday; the birthday of the trees! Tu Bi'Shvat is a wonderful celebration that allows people to go outside, roam amongst nature and enjoy the beauty around us. And this is exactly what we did as a whole school during the morning of Tu Bi'Shvat.

First, Ms Schurr held a short assembly for the whole school to explain the importance of the festival, what it represents and why we celebrate it altogether. Then, in class partners, we walked to Putney's Cenotaph to be surrounded amongst nature, trees and open spaces. Here, the pupils were tasked with a fun Scavenger Hunt activity, where they had to find different objects from nature that represented various categories. For example, 'find something that is soft / rough / straight.' After hunting for as many different objects as we could, we shared our knowledge and findings altogether before making our way back to school. All the teachers were very impressed and proud of the pupils' behaviour and how they represented our school amazingly well. Bravo, Mosaic!



Mathematics Enrichment Activities

NSPCC Number Day 2025

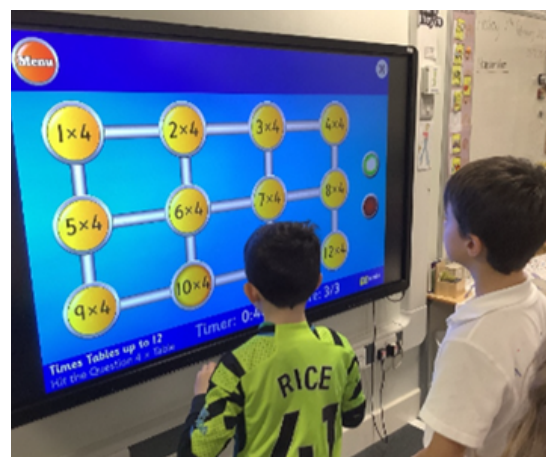
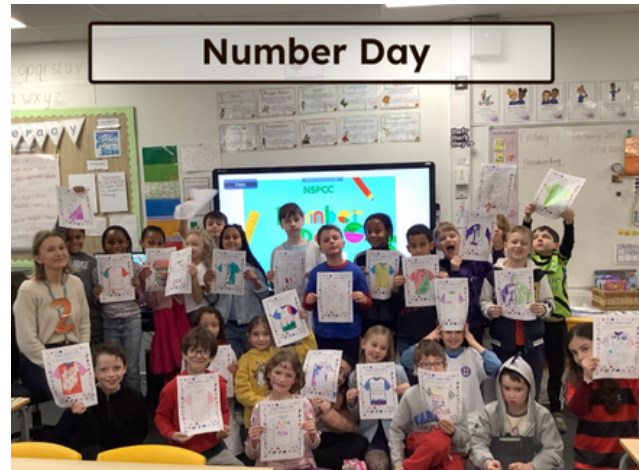
Each year, the NSPCC encourage schools nationwide to participate in Number Day to promote a love of Math and raise awareness and money to support their important services. Now, here at Mosaic, we love our Maths, and our children (and staff!) are always eager to dress for digits and have a whole day centred around numbers, shapes and various other areas of Math! This year, our STEM stars also organised and held a number-themed Bake Sale to raise money for the NSPCC.

In Reception, we used our counting skills to decorate biscuits with smarties. We split them into even and odd piles and made sure to include a few with repeating patterns. Throughout the day, we played counting games, sang shape songs and created repeating patterns both in our art and using body percussion.

Year 1 had a great Number Day, using their already acquired skills in a range of games and activities throughout the day. We started the day with the Buddy key challenge, created our own number representation head bands, decorated cupcakes for the Bake Sale and finished with a number dedicated Music session.

Year 2 drew colourful arrays, played a range of mathematical games on Hit the Button and designed their own number T-shirt! We also teamed up with Year 1 and decorated cupcakes for our NSPCC bake sale with icing and number sprinkles.

Year 3 played Maths games on Kahoot and Hit the Button; Maths board games, Crack the Codes and Times Tables challenges. We also decorated Maths-themed biscuits for the STEM stars' Bake Sale.



Year 4 became Mathematical Explorers, working together to help solve and progress through Hypatia's Mathematical Maze. This is a really fun interactive game on BBC Bitesize, that allows the class to work in partners trying to crack codes in order to progress and continue through different levels to try and get the end prize. We were working with Multiplication, Division and column method for Addition and Subtraction. Luckily, every team successfully finished the games and obtained the prize!



Year 5 were assigned a number and worked on developing their fluency with it. They then took on the challenge of creating an A-Z list to expand their mathematical vocabulary within a given time frame. Next, they participated in an NRICH maze activity, navigating through the maze to reach a total of 100 or create a significant number. To conclude the day, each student had fun making a fraction cupcake, combining learning with creativity.

Year 6 played Maths games involving dice, rocks, paper and scissors, and we used measuring skills to make bowls of icing and whipped cream.

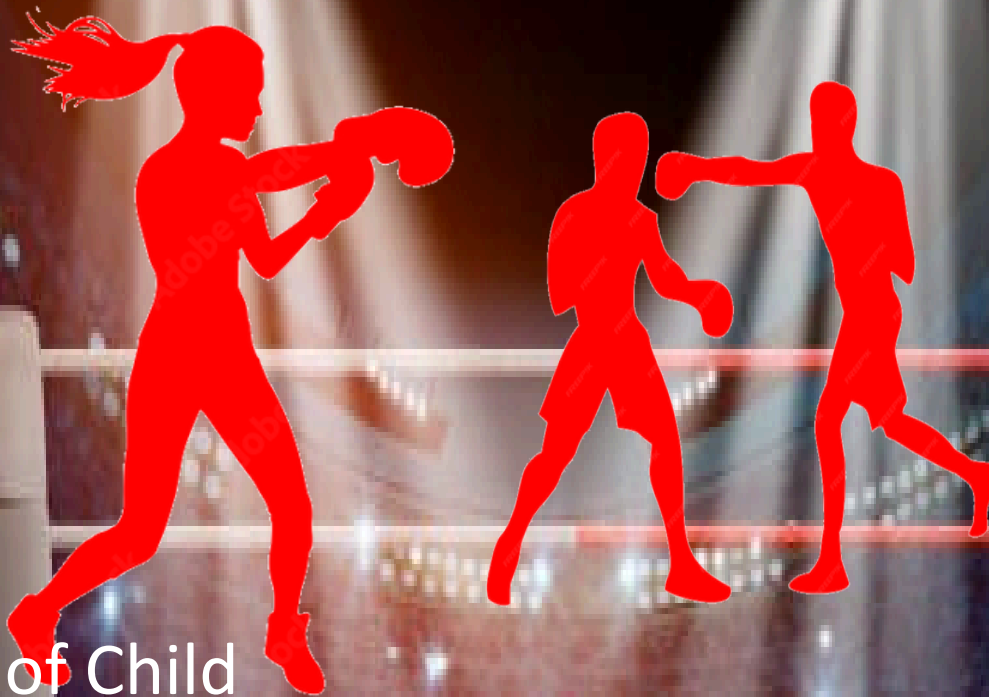
